Electronic Devices and Cellphones while on the School Bus

St. Mary's Catholic School prohibits students from the use of personal electronic devices and cell phones during and after school hours. *However, parents may authorize permission for use of an electronic device for their child while riding the school bus.* All rules found in the SMS Family Handbook still apply to your child. Electronic devices include, but are not limited to cell phones, laptops, iPads, iPods, portable gaming devices and electronic books.

Additional rules for the bus:

- Students may not share their screen with another student or position their screen in a way that allows other students to view it.
- Students may not share their electronic device with another student.
- All electronic devices must be silent or use headphones/earbuds during any usage including video chats, phone calls, etc.
- Students may not take any videos or photos while riding the bus.

Students who violate these rules and/or St. Mary's Acceptable Use Policy may permanently lose technology privileges.
